

Chatting with Charlie – January 2014

I am writing this month with only one intention – to give thanks. The reason I quite often say in my prayers that we should be thankful and grateful is because there is no one I know who has more to be thankful for.

As I look back on my life I realize that I had no earthly idea where I was headed when I finished college in 1971. Facing the draft and uncertainty God sent me to Quantico Virginia to become a Marine Officer. By the time I was trained the Marines had left Vietnam and I was part of the post Vietnam Marine Corps. Along the way I learned that once a Marine always a Marine and that Marines always take care of their own. I met a quiet little girl from North Georgia at Camp Lejeune during the summer of 1972 who thought a certain second lieutenant looked good in his dress whites. Elaine and I celebrated 39 wonderful years of marriage last month.

In 1975 I entered the MBA program at the University of South Carolina on the way to becoming of all things a CPA. At Carolina, with the help of others, I led the resurgence of the honorary accounting fraternity and later led the formation of the accounting alumni association, the Friends of the Accounting Department.

From 1977 – 2003 I worked for 3 international accounting firms in the Carolinas and Tampa. I was blessed to have a great boss in Charlotte who mentored me and taught me what serving others was all about. I always strived to mentor those who worked directly for me and to build relationships of trust with my clients and those I worked with in the firms. By the grace of God I worked my way up the ranks and served as a partner in 2 of the firms for 16 years during my 27 year career.

In 2003 God called me away from the career he had given me to finish the seminary education I begun in Tampa. After graduating from Dallas Theological Seminary in 2006, we moved to Jacksonville where I worked on a few things before entering the Ordination process of the PCUSA in 2009. Along the way I grew from briefly serving as a hospital chaplain, an intern at a local church, pulpit supply and interim pastor.

I am convinced that all along God was preparing me to do one thing – to be the Pastor of Weirsdale Presbyterian Church. For me as your interim pastor to become your permanent pastor, God had to change the longstanding rules against that and He did.

Our 16 months together as your interim pastor flew by but the never ending process started to wear me down at the end. But it is effectively over. Steve Lytle, Cathy Skoff, Betty McEuen and I have to tell our story to the Presbytery at its meeting on Saturday February 1st in St. Augustine.

Again I want to thank our Triune God for: loving me for over 64 years and sending me to you; giving me a loving partner in life in Elaine; for your love and support and for not only calling me as your pastor, but allowing a Big Kid like me to be himself and to lead and serve with a group of characters like you. Indeed I am eternally grateful to our Triune God for holding me in his loving arms and always being there for me. Thanks again.

SCALLOPED PINEAPPLE

40-50 Minutes in a 325° Oven

A frequently requested recipe from Betty McEuen.



- 4 C fresh Bread Crumbs
- 1 #2 can crushed Pineapple & juice
- 1 C Sugar
- 1 C melted Oleo
- 3 Eggs
- 1 C Milk

Combine bread crumbs, sugar, oleo, eggs and mix well. Add pineapple to milk; then combine all together. Bake at 325° for 45-50 minutes or until well browned. Can be used as a vegetable or a dessert.

One Last Look Back on 2013:


Arts and Crafts League "Elves" Push Past the Goal for Operation Shoebox.

It was barely past 8:30 a.m. on a chill December morning. The Craft room of the Horizon Center was already humming with activity. Sewing machines whirred; bolts of colorful cloth filled tables. Production momentum accelerated. The Arts and Crafts League was on a mission—and a very important one.

Volunteers set to work to help Monarch Resident Carol Dalbeck and members of the Weirsdale Presbyterian Church to reach their goal of sewing 2000 Christmas Stockings for Operation Shoebox. In spite of an intricate, multi-step process, members never lost their craftsman's "touch" nor their sense of humor. They matched fabric designs with templates, and used contrasting red or gold fabric to produce a beautiful product. These stocking were the medium that would send a message to soldiers in various parts of the Middle East that the folks back home care about them. However, as deadline approached, piles of stockings remained unfinished. No stranger to challenges, the League reserved another morning for work on December 4. Many members took work home. On the second work day, seven machines hummed; workers ironed and trimmed. Even fabric scraps that fell to the floor were gathered for use at the local Humane Society. Finished items were counted and recounted. Would they do it?

What Carol thought to be a final count of 2,223 grew into 2,248 when an "Elf" made a surprise delivery to her house. The stockings were then delivered to a local receiving center for Operation Shoebox, filled with toiletries, candy, snacks, paperbacks and a note from the volunteers. Many soldiers write back with their thanks. With any luck, some of those notes will make it to the Craft Room.

Did anyone count her hours or her effort? It's doubtful. Take your bows, Elves, knowing that a soldier's holiday was a bit brighter, thanks to you. Indeed, service is measured in many ways, so do celebrate your achievement as we welcome in the New Year.


