# **Chatting with Charlie – December 2013**

2013 has come and gone. It's time for us to reflect on the past year and look forward to 2014. It's time to make resolutions for the New Year because we want to improve ourselves and our quality of life. The top resolutions, for most people, tend to revolve around the same three things: money, health and family.

Here's the set of New Year's resolutions for you and the church I shared with you last year. I hope that we will take the time to reflect on how we did in 2013 and how they can be part of our lives in 2014:

- 1. <u>Pray more</u>. So he said to me, "This is the word of the LORD. 'Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit,' says the LORD Almighty (Zechariah 4:6, NIV).
- 2. <u>Share the Good News of Jesus Christ in word and deed.</u> I have become all things to all men so that by all possible means I might save some (I Corinthians 9:22, NIV).
- 3. <u>Take care of yourself spiritually.</u> Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me (Philippians 3:12, NIV).
- 4. <u>Make the tough decisions you know are best.</u> And now, compelled by the Spirit, I am going to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there. I only know that in every city the Holy Spirit warns me that prison and hardships are facing me. However, I consider my life worth nothing to me, if only I may finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me the task of testifying to the gospel of God's grace (Acts 20:22-24, NIV).
- 5. <u>Take care of your family.</u> A leader must be well-thought-of, committed to his wife, attentive to his own children and having their respect. For if someone is unable to handle his own affairs, how can he take care of God's church? (I Timothy 3:2-5, Msg)
- 6. <u>Love people, not just crowds.</u> If I speak with human eloquence and angelic ecstasy but don't love, I'm nothing but the creaking of a rusty gate. If I speak God's Word with power, revealing all his mysteries and making everything plain as day, and if I have faith that says to a mountain, "Jump," and it jumps, but I don't love, I'm nothing. If I give everything I own to the poor and even go to the stake to be burned as a martyr, but I don't love, I've gotten nowhere. So, no matter what I say, what I believe, and what I do, I'm bankrupt without love (I Corinthians 13:1-3, Msg).
- 7. **Reflect on God's blessings**. We all go through trials and tribulations some of us worse than others. But remember what God has brought you through before and He will never let you go. God will continue to hold you in His loving arms now and for all eternity. Thank Him for His Loving Kindness.



## Love INC's 2nd Annual Christmas Sanctuary Tour




