Every Sunday morning, as Ellen and I prepare to come to church, the psalmist expresses how we feel as we come to church here in Weirsdale. It is always a joy to be a part of this wonderful congregation. In the past, there have been times when both of us dreaded going to church. But, because I was the pastor and she was my wife, we forced ourselves to go. Our kids knew not to plan anything on Saturday evenings because I was a wreck getting ready for Sunday morning.

Through the years, working with the church became a drag. It was exhausting. There is only so much that one person can do. Things become difficult when you are expected to preach, teach Sunday school, teach Wednesday night Bible study, visit, care for the sick, lead the choir, do funerals, perform weddings, take care of the administration of the church, be active in the community as a representative of the church and be available 24/7. That doesn't count all that Ellen was doing. She was working full-time at a Girls Residential Treatment Home as the Clinical Supervisor. She played the organ, piano and keyboard every Sunday, oversaw special musical programs which she wrote, and taught Sunday school. Oh, and by the way, you must be there whether you're sick or not. As you can see, that can get tiresome.

Once we retired it was nice to be able to choose whether we wanted to go to church or not. So, for almost 3 years we could say to ourselves, 'I just don't feel like going this morning'. That feeling was liberating. We could lay back and be lazy once in a while. Now mind you, that didn't happen often but at least we had a choice.

Then in October 2017 our lives were changed. We met you all. It did not take very long for us to fall in love with the people here at Weirsdale. Where once I dreaded Saturdays because Sunday followed; now when Saturday comes we're excited about Sunday morning. Ellen and I enjoy your fellowship. Serving as your "Stated Pulpit Supply" has been fulfilling. Being with you all has given me the opportunity to get to know many of you better. Since February, when I actually began serving you here part-time, I have had the honor of visiting over 34 families. Not only that, God has blessed us to have received 12 people into the membership of the church since December.

Now, summer is upon us. Many of our congregation have gone north for the summer. When that happens, it tends to put a burden upon the church. Also, we are, at present, losing several families that are moving away. So, it's very important for all of us to keep up the excitement that we feel by being together. May the Lord bless us in the weeks and months to come to be the people God wants us to be.














The food was delicious and John McEuen entertained us with his culinary performance while preparing our dinner!

TACO CASSEROLE

1 lb lean ground beef or turkey

1 med. onion finely chopped

1 med green pepper finely chopped

1 clove garlic finely chopped (or garlic powder)

4 oz. mushrooms finely chopped

1 - 1 oz. pack of taco seasoning

Dash salt-pepper

1 - 14 oz. can diced tomatoes--do not drain

1 - 4 oz can of tomato sauce

2 Tbsp cilantro finely chopped

1 - 4 oz. bag nacho cheese chips --crush some of them finely for the topping

2 cups Mexican blended cheese shredded--save some for the topping

Saute green pepper, garlic, mushrooms and onion until the onion is translucent.

Add ground beef (or turkey) and all seasonings stirring frequently.

Cook until beef is done.

Stir in tomatoes, tomato sauce, some of the nacho chips and cheese saving some for the top of the casserole.

Pour into a casserole dish.

Sprinkle remaining chips and cheese on top.

Bake at 350° for 10 to 20 minutes until cheese on top is melted and golden brown.
