

Volunteers (Marlys, Jim, Lorna, Bill and Linda) met at the elementary school January 29th to assist with the school's annual Science Fair Event.



At our stations, the students learned how predatory animals use their sense of smell to find their food and the students tested their own senses of smell with prepared test tubes of vanilla, coconut, vinegar, onion and lemon. They learned how different foods affect the liver and had real pieces of liver to experiment with! At the "Poop Table" (yes, that is what it was called), students were shown what the poop of different animals looked like so they could identify animals by their droppings. At another table, the topic was scabs and how they look, how they are formed and how they should be left alone when on your body.

So the next time the school asks us for Science Fair volunteers, hopefully you haven't been scared away because it was a fun and exciting evening. The students had hands-on experience and learned many interesting facts.

#### POSTAGE STAMP MISSION

Diana McDonald wants to thank you all for saving your cancelled postage stamps for the Alliance Stamp Ministry. She recently mailed in 10,000 stamps contributed by our church!

They will be used in support of the Spanish language curriculum used in Sunday schools in Latin America. She asks that you continue saving stamps and turning them in.

Instructions for the stamps are as follows:

- 1. Carefully trim leaving a border around each stamp of 1/4" to 1/3". Do not remove from envelope.
- 2. Place stamps in plastic bag and leave on table at the door as you enter Douglas Hall. No paper clips, rubber bands or saran wrap around the stamps, please.

- 3. Use the following categories of US postage stamps:
- Small common 1/2¢ through current postal rates
- High value, large commemoraties on white or pastel paper
- Presorted, precancelled and bulk rate
- Priority stamps \$2.40, \$2.90 and up
- Canadian commemoratives, small common, Christmas

#### WE LOST FRIENDS THIS MONTH




Richard Bradley went home to be with the Lord on January 12th.
