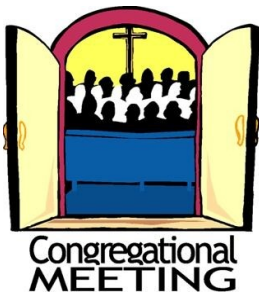

The entire event was very well organized and flowed smoothly so that everyone had a great meal and a good time.

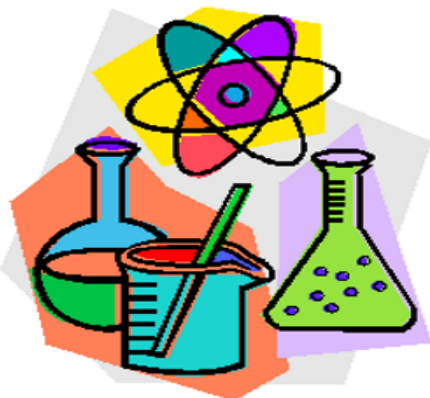
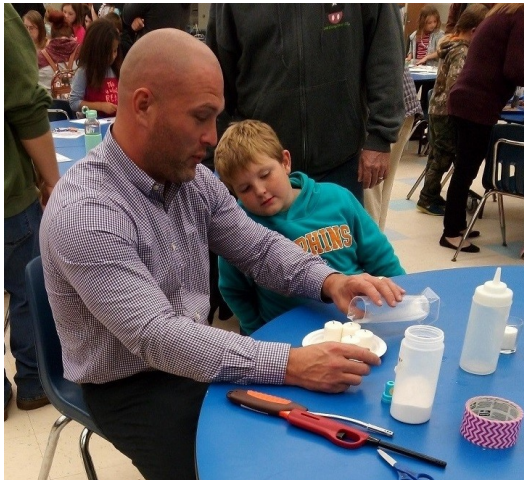
Unfortunately there is not enough room to recognize all who were involved preparing and serving the dinner but here are a few pictures I was able to get early in the morning.

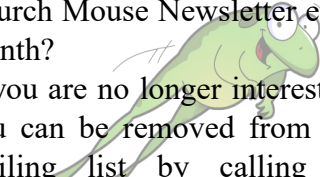

CELEBRATING THE BIRTH OF THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN SCOTLAND

You are invited to wear your kilts to church on Sunday, Feb. 16th, to commemorate the birth of the Presbyterian Church in Scotland.

The roots of Presbyterianism trace back to the mid-16th century when John Calvin left Catholicism and joined the Reformation Movement. He became a minister and theologian who revolutionized the Christian church in Europe, America and eventually all over the world.

John Knox lived in Scotland and in the mid-1500's, he led the Reformation in Scotland following Calvin's principles. His ideas set the moral tone for the Church of Scotland. The Presbyterian form of church government and Reformed theology were formally adopted as the national Church of Scotland in 1690 and it remains Presbyterian today.

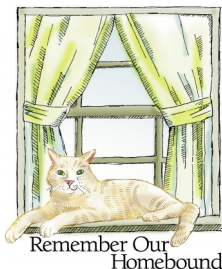
